Pupil Premium Statement 2014-2015

About the Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools for children of statutory school age who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or children who have been eligible in the last six years. It is also for children who have been looked after by the local authority continuously for more than six months, and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. Schools will be held accountable for how the additional funding is used to support pupils and are required to show the impact of this spending.

Use of Pupil Premium 2014-2015

For the academic year 2014-2015 Cannon Lane Primary School was allocated a 'Pupil Premium' amount of £1300 per child.

The number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium was 29 (4.3%).

This amount was used to support eligible pupils in the following ways:

- Focused support in recognising auditory discrimination of initial sounds
- Supporting social needs through social skills groups
- Teaching assistant support in developing fine motor skills and gross motor skills
- Support staff used to promote understanding inferences from texts
- Focused intervention to develop spellings and grammar in KS2
- Support in using and applying the four rules of number and understanding word problems in mathematics in KS2
- Supporting learning of musical instruments and involvement in extracurricular activities

The Impact on Pupils

At the end of Key Stage 2 (2015), 5% of the Year 6 cohort was eligible for Pupil Premium funding. 100% of these children achieved Level 4 in Reading and Writing. Above 50% of these children achieved Level 5 or above in Reading, Writing and Maths. In addition, 17% of these children achieved a Level 6 in Maths, compared to 7% nationally.

At the end of Key Stage 1 (2015), 4.2% of the Year 2 cohort was in receipt of Pupil Premium funding. 80% of the cohort exceeded national expectations and achieved Level 2b or above in Reading, Writing and Maths.

Proposed use of Pupil Premium 2015-2016

For this academic year the level of the premium is £1300 per pupil provision is planned on an individual basis to ensure that we best meet the needs of each eligible child.

The number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium is currently twenty two (3%).

The funding allocated is planned to be used in the following ways:

- To target needs through teaching assistant support within phases for an allocated time specifically to support and enrich the individualised needs of those children
- To train staff in narrowing the gap
- To subsidise educational day visits, residential trips, in school events and after school clubs
- To provide enrichment opportunities for more able children including music, writing, creative arts and maths
- To provide counselling for specific children
- To release a teacher for a day a week to mentor and support individual pupils
- To provide additional release time for the Mathematics Leader and the English Leader to support children in whole class settings, in small groups and on a one-to-one basis as appropriate
- To fund the attendance of Forest School to support the development of wellbeing, leadership and social skills for specific children
