Kindly ensure your child has an up to date and labelled PE kit; your child's class teacher will inform you regarding the exact day. Please encourage your child to bring in a water bottle to school which they can take home to clean and refill daily.

Please support your child's learning by ensuring homework tasks are completed within the set, allotted timeframes. If your child struggles to complete his/ her homework please liaise with the class teacher to receive additional support.

Additionally, please remember to sign your child's homework diaries and reading record books so that you are fully aware of continued progress.

**Home Learning:**

<b>Spellings</b>	These will be set every Friday and your child will be given a related spellings-task to be handed in the following Wednesday. Your child will be tested on his/her spellings every Friday.
<b>Mathematics</b>	An array of differentiated mathematical tasks will be set throughout the course of the term. Homework will be set every Wednesday and will be due back the following Monday.
<b>Topic including Science</b>	Project-style homework will be set every 2-3 weeks; this will encourage pupils to build upon their research skills, as well as showcase their creativity.
<b>Reading</b>	It is recommended that your child reads each day and we are grateful for your support with this.

During the course of this term all the Year 6 children will have a fantastic opportunity to visit the RAF Museum. Your child's class teacher and the school office will liaise with you via email about the days, times and contribution for this trip.

Your child will also have the opportunity to visit the library during the course on the week; the timings will change on a rota basis.

If you decide your child should walk from school home independently, kindly inform the school office or child's class teacher in writing.
